

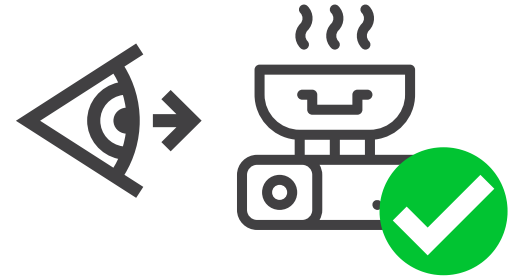
Important fire safety tips



Ensure smoke alarms are not covered or disconnected. Report beeping smoke alarms to maintenance.



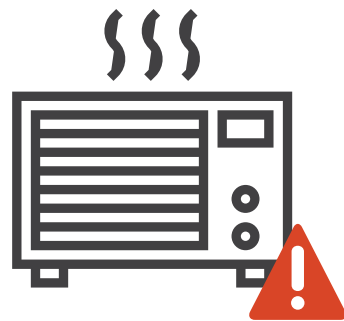
Do not touch, hang anything on or tamper with fire sprinklers.



Never leave cooking unattended in the kitchen. When cooking, keep looking.



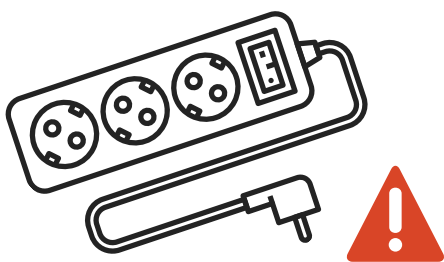
Never leave burning candles or incense unattended.



Keep clothing and other flammable materials at least 1m away from air conditioning units and heaters.



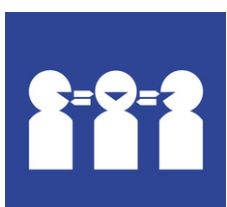
If you smoke, fully extinguish cigarettes in ashtrays filled with sand or water. Use heavy, high-sided ashtrays.



Do not overload power boards.



Keep balconies, hallways and evacuation routes clear of clutter and rubbish. Know your evacuation plan.

What to do in case of fire



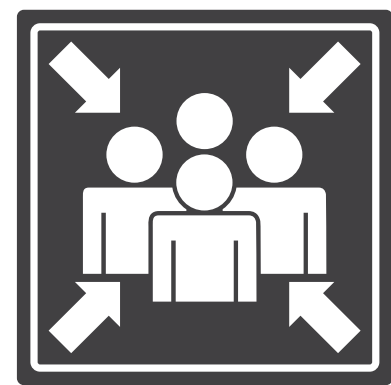
- 1** **ASSIST** anyone in immediate danger (only if safe to do so)

- 2** **GET DOWN LOW** to stay out of the smoke.



- 3** Exit the home and **CLOSE** doors and windows (if safe to do so)

- 4** **EVACUATE:** Leave by nearest emergency exit and alert others as you leave (if safe to do so)



- 5** **CALL 000 (triple zero)** when you are safe outside. Be ready to give your address.

- 6** **MOVE** to the assembly area nominated on your building's evacuation plan and stay there. Never go back into a burning room or building
